

Nothing was shown at the preliminary hearing, according to Judge Lazarus, to connect Arbuckle with the charge of murder, which was brought under the California statute providing that a life taken in rape or attempted rape is murder. Judge Lazarus declared, however, that Arbuckle's conduct warranted holding him for manslaghter, as he might have committed bat-

A grand jury indictment for manslaughter also was returned against Arbuckle, altho District Attorney Matthew A. Brady chose to try the defendant on the police court holding. The coronor's jury charged him with manslaghter.
