

Just after opening the gavel was sounded and the conference came to order, Mr. Balfour conferred earnestly with Lord Admiral Beatty. There was no prayer at the opening of the conference today, and the statements of the foreign delegations came without preliminary de-

In announcing the program of decision of the "Big Five," Secetary Hughes said, "It is the intention of this committee, consisting of all plenipotentiary delegates, to consider all matters reported to the plenary sessions." He then announced the plan outlined in respect to the Far Eastern question.

Mr. Balfour, in telling how he heard Secretary Hughes' proposals last Saturday, said that he suddenly realized that he was participating in "a great historical event." "I congratulate you, Mr. Hughes, on the fact that you have added a new anniversary which benceforth will be observed in connection with this movement towards a great reconstruction.'

When Baron Kato, in his speech, declared that Japan was willing to make sweeping reducions in her fleet, the audience rose and applauded for several minutes, and a hush then filled the hall for a period.




