#### HAS SCHEME TO BEAT POOR WORKING GIRLS

CHICAGO, Dec. 9.-A new scheme for defrauding working girls of their savings is being practiced in Eastern cities by a man claiming to be the auditor of a Chicago paper box factory, according to an announcement by

the Illinois Bankers Association. He first appeared in Philadelphia early in October, then moved to Pittsburgh, and from there to Providence R. I.
