WASHINGTON, Jan. 27.—Union labor won a victory in the National Agricultural Conference in session here today when the conference voted to strike out of the committee report recommendations, for repeal of the Adamson eight hour law.

PITTSBURG, Pa., Jan. 27.—Officers of the First National Bank of Crafton, which was robbed today, announced that a check of the bank showed that the bandits got away with \$15,000 in cash and \$80,000 in bonds.

PITTSBURG, Pa., Jan. 27.—Five men walked into the First National Bank at Crafton, a suburb of this city this morning, and after killing the assistant cashier forced five clerks in the bank and a woman customer into the vault of the bank and robbed the bank of approximately \$30,000 in cash. The bandits also got considerable negotiable securities.

They made their escape in an automobile before the robbery was discovered. It was the boldest daylight robbery committed in the Pittsburgh district in many months.

Later in the day the bandits were overtaken by detectives, reinforced by available reserve policemen from the North Side, and motorcycle officers from the downtown district, after the robbers had abandoned their machine and taken refuge in a building. From the building the robbers staged a battle with the officers. Stationing themselves advantageously the robbers opened fire on the police who prepared to rush the building.

Barricaded out of range of bullets, the pitched battle ensued. Great crowds were attracted by

the fusillade and gathered in the vicinity of the building and watched the battle.

Although the police had the bandits surrounded in the building and exchanged shots with them for some time, they made a clean escape.

HATTIESBURG, Miss., Jan. 27.—The Girault Motor Company located in this city, was robbed this morning by masked men, who held up the office employes and got away with \$180,000 in cash, bonds and paper notes.

The night clerk at the office of the motor company said that he was confronted by two masked men with revolvers, who forced him to open the register. The clerk claims that he was locked in the closet and the robbers then forced the safe and got away with the cash and securities.

## TRANSIENT MAN DIES IN CAMP

John Dennis, age 36 years, died suddenly about nine o'clock Thursday night in a tent near the Elm Creek bridge, where the family had been camped for the past several days.

Deceased had been complaining for several days, being afflicted with a bad cold and something like la grippe, but was apparently recovering and was able to be up and around as usual. Several head of horses around the camp and the life the family were living indicated that they were horse traders, and for some time had been drifting from place to place, stopping for work where hands were needed.

The remains of the man were turned over to the King-Holt undertaking department and prepared for burial and laid to rest in Evergreen Cemetery Friday afternoon. Dr. Alvin Swindell called at the tent to see what help the family needed, if any.
