



> OLD CITY ON TEMPLE SITE American Archeologists Have Convinced Themselves of Facts Concerning Angient Sardis.

Doctor Hogarth, keeper of the Ash is molean museum in Oxford, recently to gave a series of lectures on the excanations conducted by American archeologist's at Sardis. About fifty Latin inscriptions were discovered in the temple ruins by the America's. The object of the undertaking was to settle the question as to whether the temple columns stood on the site of the ancient Sardis or whether it had disappeared with the collapse of Furnishing and placing the fol- the acropolis. The archeologists satisfied themselves that the ancient town did stand on the temple site built originally in the Fourth century indeed, one of the inscriptions discov ered dates back to the time of Antigonous, or about 300 B. C. Traces have also been found of an earlier sandstone temple under the other fragments. 
