According to Water Superin tendent Lusk, Ballinger has about one month's water supply in the Elm Creek reservoir, and then the Colorado River supply will be drawn on again. The upper dam was tapped several days ago, and the water permitted to flow into the lower lake.

On account of the drouth the move to curtail consumption, and according to Mr. Lusk there will be none. The consumers will be permitted to use all the water they want until the Elm reservoir is drained dry, and then it will be back to the good old Colorado where there is plenty and to spare—such as it is.


