The total vote in No. 1 in the last primary was 425 and in No. 24 the total vote in the second primary was 345. However, the vote will be the largest ever polled here in a

SPANGLER, Penna., Nov. 7.—The bodies of COURT; ON BALLOT fifty miners, who lost their lives in the Reilly mine explosion here yesterday had been recovered up to a late hour this morning, and thirteen more bodies have been located in the mine, but had not been brought to the top.

Thirty-two who were injured are in hospitals, and most of them, it is believed, will recover. The remainder of those who entered the mine yesterday morning have probably perished, rescuers said. It is now believed that the total number of dead will reach eighty.




