

Unnamed babies are causing the erty interests. state health department much trouble and parents are doing their babies a great injustice by not naming them, according to a etter from W. H. Beasley, state health officer.

The law requires physicians, or midwives, to report births, in order that a record of all births an be kept, and where babies are not named the records are incomelete. The following letter to county Clerk Forgey points out the importance of all babies being named before the vital statistics record is made up:

"It has been noted that many birth reports come in with the space provided for name of child containing 'Not named.' This failure to name the child entails a considerable inconvenience to the office force, necessitating a large volume of correspondence and supplementary reports.

"Please call this to the attention of the doctors and midwives and request them to advise parents that this matter so often overlooked on their part is quite embarrassing to the child or


