J. A. STREET FOUND DEAD AT VALLEY CREEK HOME

The body of J. A. Street was found in his yard on the W. T. Padgett place on Valley Creek, seven miles West of Ballinger, shortly after noon Thursday, with a shot-gun nearby. A charge from the weapon had ended Mr. Street's life instantly, and W. T. Padgett, who visited his farm, found the body presumably a short time after death.

"Many farmers in our county are now raising them around their homes and in some instances they roost with the chickens. Their delicious meat comes at a time of year when the frying size chickens have been used up and it is too cold for fishing.

They can be raised in West Texas by the millions if they are treated right. They are not a game bird' in the same sense as the Bob White, and there is little more sport in hunting them than there would be in hunting Leghorn chickens. They were intended by nature as a domestic fowl and if the people can be persuaded to respect the rights of others they can be raised in abundance on every farm in the state, thus adding to the happiness of the home.
