GERMAN REVOLT LEADER FREED

MUNICH, Bavaria, April 1 .--General Ludendorff, former German field marshall, was acquitted here today on a charge of treason for his part in an unsuccessful revolt last November.

Adolph Hitler and former chief of police Puchnor were convicted of treason charges and each sentenced to five years imprisonment and fined two hundred gold marks each.

Others accused of being Hitler's aides in the revolt were given prison sentences.


