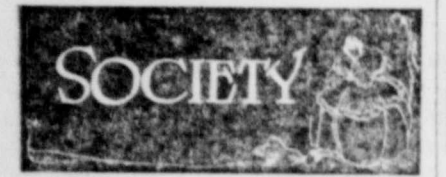

A dozen onlookers—some merely waiting to see what is going to happen—others giving advice and direction. But none of these will start the cart moving.

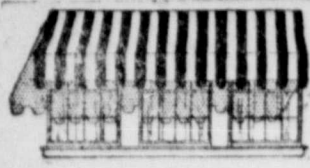

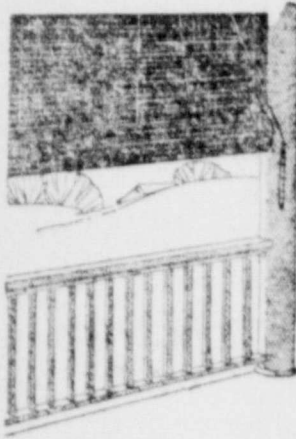

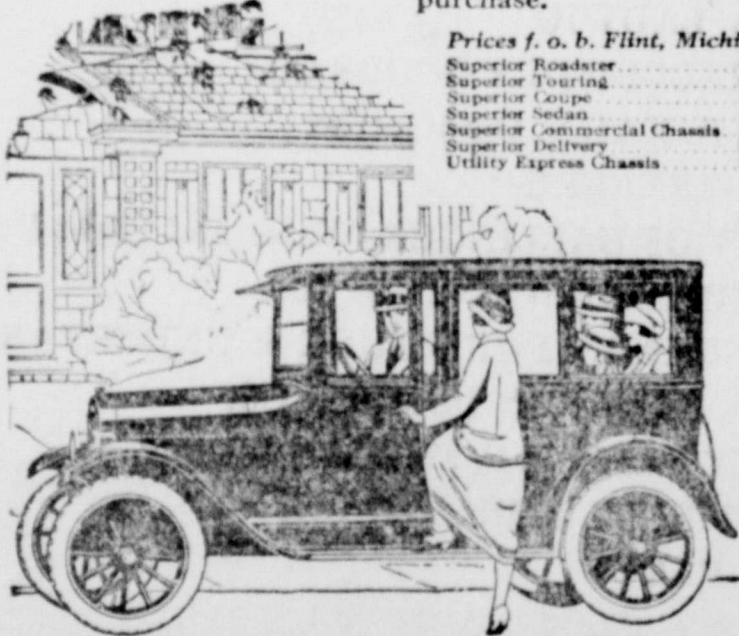
