



64,206 PEOPLE USED TELEPHONE DURING FAIR

During the Runnels County Fair week the local office of the West Texas Telephone Co. kept a traffic record of the local business handled from 8:00 a. m. Monday, October 13th to 10:00 p. m., Saturday, October 18th, this record being kept for a 14 hour period each day and the figures show the following facts

For the period 32,103 local calls were handled averaging 5,350 calls per day. This will give an hourly average of 381 calls and the time elapsed in answering the line signals averaged 1.05 seconds.

Taking the average time of each conversation at 3 1-2 minutes will in using the telephone, on the basis of an 8-hour work day it would require 2 persons, (one on each end of the connection) 234 What delights each Sluphur Comhandled in the 6 days.

As it takes 2 persons to complete a call the calling party and the called party, this will show the telephones of the Ballinger exchange were used 64,206 times or more than 10 calls per station for the total number of telephones in the exchange.
