## Ambulance Service Explains Patient Transfer Policies

"We most definitely will take
patients to another facility without stopping at West Plains
Medical Center first,", said
Richelle Watkins, supervisor of Richelle Watkins, supervisor of
the WPMC Ambulance Serice.
"However, we must have the "However, we must have the
coperation of the people we
serve," she continued. "First, we must have a doctor willing to
take the responsibility at the other end (another hospital or
facility) and he must be
contacted prior to any transfer. Also, we have to know they
have knowledge prior to the
transfer, and approve the transtransfer, and approve the trans-
fer without stopping at the
nearest hospital. "And," she continued, "any
transfer must be cleared with the other facility and we wust
be assured they will receive the be assured they will receive the
patient once we arrive. It is terrible to have a hospital,
perhaps as far away as Lubbock General, not be expecting the
patient and turn us down the patient and turn us down when
we arrive. In that case, we just have to return perhaps a

"The twelve men and women must decide whether Donen
and Wanda Harmon of Ruidoso, N.M., embezzled more than
\$467,000 from PSLA in 1981 and whether Stephen "Bud" Mc Ginnis, a Dallas real estate
developer, defrauded PSLA out developer, d

"Evidence has shown that the
