Man Killed in Gin at Roscoe

SWEETWATER, Oct. 1.—W. G. Owens, age 55, who was instantly killed in an accident at a gin at Roscoe yesterday, was attempting to replace a belt which had slipped off when he was caught in the line shaft and whirled to death before the machinery could be stopped. Owens' body has been shipped to Blooming Grove, Texas, his former home. A wife and two daughters survive.

FIVE BALLINGER GIRLS IN BAYLOR

BELTON, Tex., Oct. 1.—Five students from Ballinger have registered for the opening of the fall term of Baylor College for Women. They are Miss Bryan, Miss Susie Faye Hale, daughter of Dr. and Mrs. F. N. Hale, Miss Mamie Ray Preston, and Misses Beatrice and Christine Smith, daughters of Jasper Smith.

The eighty-first session of Baylor College, which opened Sept. 29, saw additions made in the college and fine arts faculties, several new courses offered and a largely increased student body, according to President J. C. Hardy.

Registration for the fall term is several hundred greater than at this time last year, indicating that last year's enrollment of 2,225, will be largely increased. Baylor College is now the third largest school for women in the United States.

W. T. U. CO. MEN MEET IN ANGELO

About the middle of October, the exact date to be announced later, the employees of the West Texas Utilities Company will gather in San Angelo for a convention similar to the one held in Ballinger last spring, according to Earl Morley, of Ballinger, manager of Group G.

Mr. Morley stated that plans for the meeting were being worked out, and the meeting promised to run a close race for breaking the record of the Ballinger meeting which was the most successful ever held.

These meetings are held for the purpose of bringing the employees of the utilities company together for a discussion of their work in the various departments and the "safety first" movement is particularly stressed. A general session is held, and group meetings are held, where the employees of the respective departments come together and discuss their particular line of work.

San Angelo has promised to assist the company in staging the social program of the convention. Employees from the forty-odd towns will be notified to attend the meeting, only a sufficient number being left at home to keep the works going.

SOUTH PLEADS FOR FAIR PLAY

ATLANTIC CITY, Oct. 1.—Plea for representation of the South on the Interstate Commerce Commission were made by Senator Oscar Underwood, of Alabama, in an address prepared for delivery today before the state bank division of the American Bankers Association.

Fair representation, Senator Underwood declared, would take the railroads out of politics and serve the producers of the country and lead to a full and satisfactory settlement of the railroad consolidation problem.

SAYS JUNIOR OFFICERS AFRAID TO TESTIFY

DEBT MISSIONS HOLD MEETING

(By Associated Press)
WASHINGTON, October 1.—France's different proposals to date for settlement of her war debt to the United States have been found unacceptable. This announcement was made after the American commission had held a conference today with President Coolidge.

After the disagreement the two commissions then called a joint session which lasted fifteen minutes and Finance Minister Cailaux informed the American commissioners that the French mission would study the situation and present the French views this afternoon.

It was accepted generally that the Americans still regard the initial payments of the French too low.

GOVERNMENT IS ADDRESS SUBJECT

(By Associated Press)
WASHINGTON, October 1.—Extending the American government's welcome to the assembled delegates, Secretary of State Kellogg declared in his address at the opening session today of the Inter-Parliamentary Union, that the presence in America of so many representatives of self-governing nations, shows that in this remarkable age the attention of the world is centered upon the study of self-government.

"Nothing can be more stimulating to the advancement of liberal ideas or will contribute more certainly to peace," the secretary said, "than for members of various parliaments and legislative bodies to meet as us and you are doing to exchange views on our respective problems."

MAY USE NEW SCHOOL BUILDING SOON

Good time is being made on the new school building, and it is probable that the ground floor rooms of the new building will be occupied within two or three weeks.

It will be some time before the building is completed and turned over to the school board, but when the first floor rooms are in shape it is expected that the board will arrange with the contractors to get possession of the rooms.

LAKEHURST, N. J., Oct. 1.—Benjamin Hereth, one of Shenandoah's survivors, and James Work, chief draftsman at the air station here, were named today by Captain Anton Heinen, German Zeppelin pilot, as the men who gave him most of his information upon which his testimony was based.

The witness said that Hereth told him what happened as the Shenandoah broke up, and Work was the man, Heinen said, who told him that those at the Lakehurst station had been fighting the valve change on airships, but without success.

NEW EMBARGO ON TEXAS CATTLE

BOSTON, Oct. 1.—Importation of cattle from Texas into Massachusetts was prohibited by an order passed today. The department of agriculture of Massachusetts is placing the ban on Texas cattle as a result of the epidemic of the foot and mouth disease in East Texas.

NEW LONDON, Conn., Oct. 1.—Rescue work on submarine S-51 is progressing as planned by Rear Admiral Christy. The admiral reported today that the weather is favorable, and slings have been attached from the submarine to the wrecking ships Monarch and Century, the communication said.

It was planned to hoist the submarine by degrees in order to minimize the strain upon the wreckers. It will take two ships two or three hours at least to lift the submarine from the water, and officers here believe that it is quite possible that a longer time will be required.



SCHOOL MARKS

Some of our school and college students feel the consciousness of a higher wisdom than the slow old timers possess. Hence out of the superiority of their conceptions, they evolve the theory that it makes little difference how high marks they get, provided only they pass.

If 60 is a passing mark, they say, then that is just as good for their purpose as 90. Also they think they should select from their lessons the things that will be particularly beneficial in the kind of a career they want, and let the rest go, so far as they can without actual flunking. And that they should go a little slow on book knowledge, so as to obtain time for the "broadening" contacts of student activities.

**TEXAS PORTS TO RECEIVE
NEW MEXICO COTTON**

(By Associated Press)

HOUSTON, Oct. 1.—Change in
pink boll worm quarantine regu-
lations is expected to bring to
Houston and Galveston approxi-
mately 50,000 bales of cotton for
export from Dona Ana county,
New Mexico. The change made
in Washington was announced
here by Dr. W. D. Hunter, mem-
ber of the federal horticultural
board.

Cotton from pink boll worm in-
fested districts must be fumig-
ated in a vacuum before it can
be moved from one state to an-
other. Dona Ana county is in
such territory. Across the state
line in El Paso county, also in-

festated territory, the fumigation
process must be observed for
interstate movements, yet this
Texas cotton may be moved to
any Texas port without fumiga-
tion, because in its movement
it crosses no state line.

Dr. Hunter said the federal de-
partment of agriculture had ab-
rogated the fumigation require-
ment for cotton grown in Dona
Ana county, because "manifestly
no practical result was obtained
by requiring fumigation of cot-
ton grown in Dona Ana county,
territory just contiguous to El
Paso county, where cotton in-
tended for export need not be
fumigated."

**HUNGARY HONORS LIVING
RATHER THAN DEAD MEN**

(By Associated Press)

BUDAPEST, Oct. 1.—In con-
tradistinction to the prevailing
custom in the allied countries to
honor the memory of their dead
war heroes by monuments, the
Hungarians make it a point to
honor those among their living
veterans who performed some act
of valor in the World War, by
making them knights of "The
Order of Heroes."

Each knight is presented with
a small plot of land. Recently
200 officers, 300 non-commis-
sioned officers and 1,300 privates
were knighted by Admiral Horty,
captain general of the order.

Every candidate for knight-
hood must show evidence of being
an irreproachable Hungarian
citizen. Among the newly
knighted veterans there was also
a small boy through whom the
memory of his dead father was
honored. The badge of the order
represents the Hungarian coat of
arms.

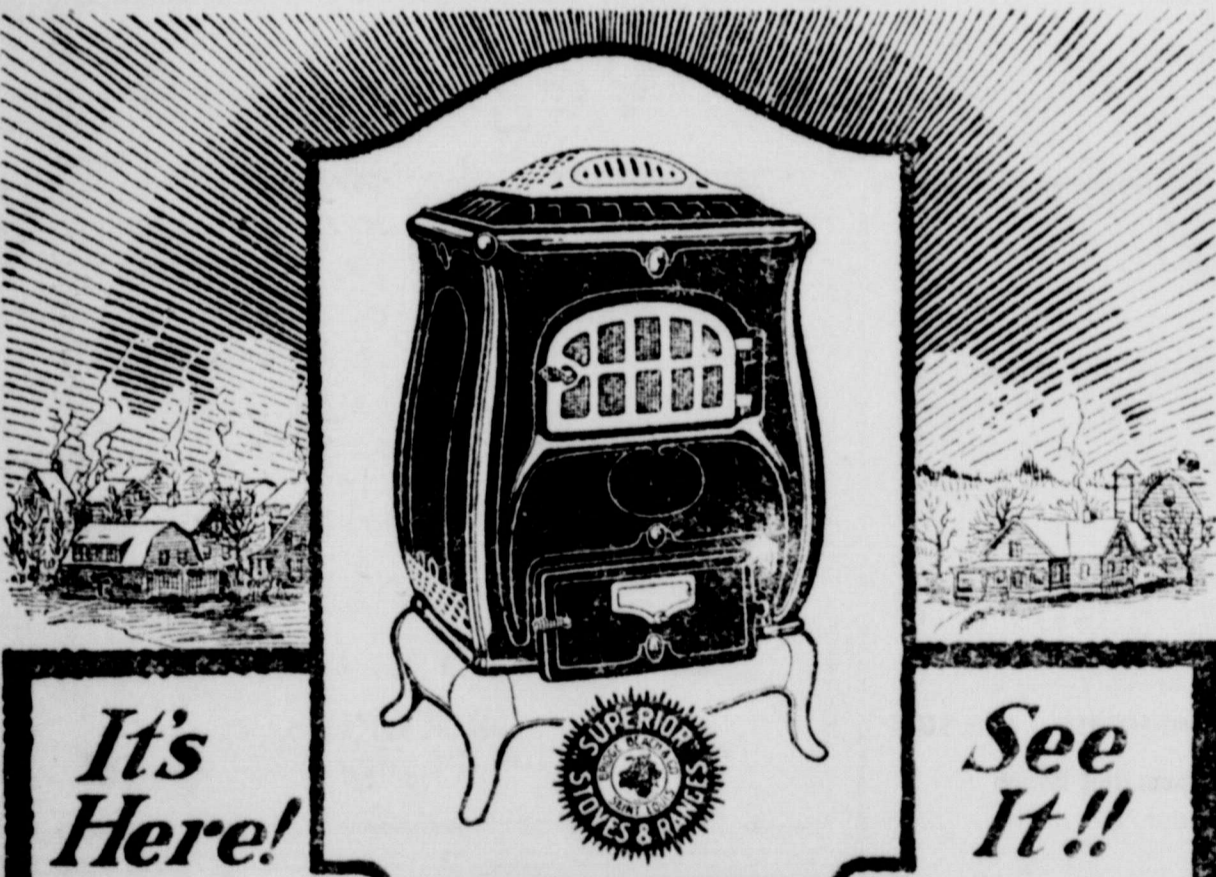

FRIGIDAIR SYSTEM FOR PIGGLY WIGGLY

Frigid air will replace ice in the cooling system of the Piggly Wiggly. Electricians began Thursday morning installing Frigidair machines in all three of the refrigerators heretofore cooled by ice. Separate machines are being installed in each ice box, as different temperatures are required under the new system of cooling or cold storage.

These machines eliminate the necessity of refilling the refrigerators with ice. It solves the ice problem. The same company, the West Texas Utilities Company, which has been supplying the ice, is installing the Frigidair machines. It is just a case of carrying the cooling process on the wires instead of on the back of the ice man.

The Frigidair machines are controlled automatically, which makes it possible to keep the temperature at the same point all the time, while under the old

system of cooling by ice the temperature varies according to the amount of ice on hand.

Another advantage claimed for the new cooling process is that a different temperature is required for preserving different foods, and the three separate cold storage departments being equipped makes it possible to provide the temperature as needed.
