WAYNESBURG, Pa., Dec. 23.-Four volunteer firemen were killed and five others injured, two of whom are considered seriously hurt, during a fire which swept the business district of Waynesburg early today.

Several buildings were destroyed and others damaged, making the total loss estimated at \$1,000,000.

The firemen were crushed under a falling wall.

BELLAIRE, Ohio, Dec. 23 .- Fire, believed to have been started when a fall of coal short-circuited electric light lines, took a toll of nine lives at the Webb Mine at Shadyside, a few miles South of here, last night. Two other miners are in a hospital suffering from the effects of smoke and gas.

Seventy-nine men is the normal force, but only 60 were at work at the mine when the fire was discovered and all made their escape except eleven who were trapped in one of the lower laterals.
