

All the symbols of the Blue Lodge are here represented, very clearly set forth. On the flap of the apron woven about the square and compasses appear the words, "Amor, Virtus, Charitas."

The book was published in New York in 1810. It also is in perfect state of preservation. reference to Masonry it says: "It is always understood that Freemasons have a secret which they carefully conceal; but from everything that can be collected. from their accounts of Masonry their real secret is not other than their origin, which but a few of them understand, and those who do, envelope it in mystery."
