# Hankow Besieged By Coolies; **British Appeal for Protection**

(By Associated Press)

PEKING, Jan. 5.—An official dispatch from Nanking says the city of WuWu has been looted, presumably by troops of the Northern Chinese Army.

The information came from the Standard Oil Company, which has considerable property there. An American destroyer has been ordered to WuWu.

PEKING, Jan. 5 .- Official foreign dispatches from Hankow, where the British colony is being besieged by thousands of infuriated coolies as the result of anti-foreign agitation, shows that the situation is growing increasingly serious and indicates the angry ORDERS GUARD natives are out of control of Chinese military forces which undertook to maintain order.

Practically all barricades to concessions have been destroyed.




