Fur Farms Replace

(By Associated Press) WASHING TON, Jan. 26. As the oldtime fur trader is being pushed further and further into the Northland by encroaching civilization, the ancient calling takes on a new note with the development in the last few years of 2,500 fur farms in the United

States and Alaska. The industry has gained such importance that the Bureau of Biological Survey of the United States Department of Agriculvestment of \$30,000,000. Canada Cone Johnson, of Tyler. ranks second with 1,500 fur farmers and an investment of approximately \$11,000,000.

The raising of fur bearing animals, however, is not limited to the North American continent, but has spread to European countries, and also to Japan. The majority of American and Canadian farmers are raising silver or blue foxes.






