J. Hall Paxton

S. Hall Paxton, son of the Rev. and Mrs. J. W. Paxton, Presbyterian missionaries, is assistant vice-consul at Nanking and is credited with effective work during the occupation of the city by the Cantonese forces. He was rescued with others by American and British forces.

Prior to that emergency he went to Kuling in person and escorted a group of 40 American men, women and children who were isolated and in danger. The party had difficulty in reaching the coast and according to letters from missionaries received in Danville, Va., where Paxton formerly lived, roaming bands of soldiers frequently stopped them and required bribes before they were permitted to proceed. It cost the party \$400 before it reached the coast.

Paxton is a graduate of Yale and also studied at Cambridge, England, and in Paris.
