## CLAUD MAINES SHOT TO DEATH IN ANGELO

(By Associated Press)  
SAN ANGELO, April 22.—Claud Maines, 28, was shot and killed today in front of the Tom Green county jail here. J. W. Lamney, a grocer, surrendered to Deputy Sheriff James White, to whom Maines was talking when he was killed.

Maines was charged with burglary in six cases, two at Menard by indictment, two each at Ballinger and Brady by complaints, according to officials here.

Cause of the shooting is undetermined.

Maines had furnished bond of \$1,000 in each case Wednesday. Lamney is in jail and refuses to make a statement.

The verdict of Justice of the Peace C. E. DuBois, coroner, was that Maines was killed by Lamney, but a charge had not been filed against him this afternoon. White is believed to have been the only eye-witness.

Two of the five pistol shots fired at close range took effect.

Maines was charged here with the theft of a trailer in Miles from W. R. Hunton, Miles banker, and also with theft of building material from the West Texas Lumber Company there. He had made bonds of \$1,000 in each case.

Sam Behringer, local grocer, went to San Angelo Friday afternoon to attend the examining trial of Mr. Lamney, who was in business there with Thad Thomson, formerly of this city. The two men operate the Piggly Wiggly stores in San Angelo.

## SHANGHAI HAS MARTIAL LAW

Chinese police patrolled the streets and all suspicious characters were searched. Six radical leaders were executed in the native quarter of Lungwa.

## WANTS SURVEY OF TEXAS EXPORTABLE PRODUCTS

HOUSTON, April 22.—Ernest L. Tutt, district manager of the Houston office of the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce, is bending his energies toward securing a commercial survey of the Texas marketing area on which to base a campaign with reference to exporting Texas products to the Caribbean states.

The department, Mr. Tutt has been informed, has funds for two marketing surveys in the United States during the next fiscal year. Mr. Tutt thinks a survey of Texas would be most profitable and far reaching.

## SAYS EAST TEXAS CAN'T COMPETE ON COTTON

(By Associated Press)

AUSTIN, April 22.—Believing that truck farming is the "hope of East Texas," State Senator Julian P. Greer of Poyner, cultivates two acres of tomatoes, virtually in his back yard.

Here for a glance around before the special session of the 40th legislature is convened early in May, Greer said he believes East Texas cannot compete with the northwestern part of the state in raising cotton.

"But," he added, "there is nothing to keep my district from making money on say tomatoes. I find it profitable and good for my health."

## SUNSHINE GIVES FLOOD SUFFERERS HOPE TODAY

(By Associated Press)

MEMPHIS, Apr. 22.—Sunshine came into the lives of refugees atop the levees in construction camps that dot the Mississippi valley today as the flood waters moved slowly south.

The loss of life is placed at 28 but it is impossible to accurately estimate the probable loss in hundreds of square miles of inundated territory, from which no word has come.

Cold weather made last night a disagreeable one for the refugees, especially in Arkansas, where disease has broken out in a number of places. Nearly every major stream in Arkansas was rising as

they spread out through crevasses or moved toward the Mississippi.

GREENVILLE, Miss., April 22.—A serious situation prevailed here today as the rapidly rising flood waters washed through the business section and caused the waterworks plant to cease pumping.

The main levees are reported to be holding.

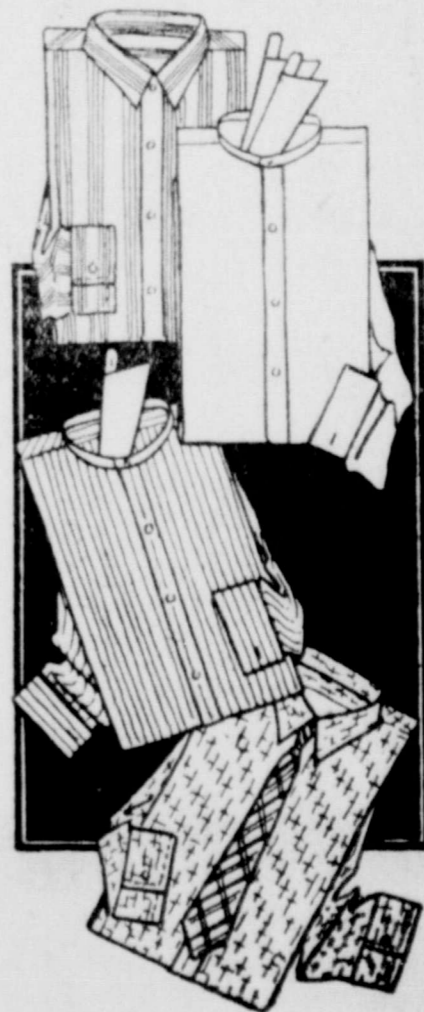

**Dare Devils Not Always Brave; May Have Inferiority Complex**



(By Associated Press)

ATLANTA, April 22.—Persons who climb up and down almost perpendicular mountain sides and delight in other death-defying feats—some of which have caused W. E. Tuggle, of Stone Mountain, to form his own personal opinions as to their sanity—are not always brave.

In fact, such tendencies frequently are the result of an inferiority complex, says Professor Herman W. Martin, psychologist of Emory University, in explaining why Tuggle, in charge of the studio at Stone Mountain, has no end of trouble with dare-devils.

Some of them have tried vainly to scale the solid granite wall, about 900 feet in height, to the site of the Confederate memorial work. The stairway, which led from the top to the scene of carving, 250 feet below, has been removed, but the pegs, ten feet apart, holding the structure were left. So every now and then someone will attempt to slide from peg to peg to the operating base, with the knowledge that the missing of a single hold will result in a drop to death.

"Such attempts," says Martin, "sometimes may be regarded as a sort of compensation for a failure somewhere else in life; they may be performed to quell imbedded yet possibly unrecognized feelings of inferiority."

Two men were fined for fighting Thursday night on a down town street. They paid their fines Friday morning.

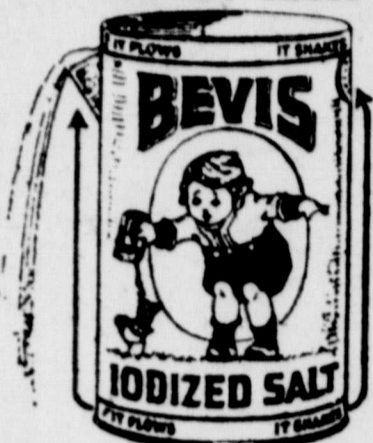
### WINTERS MEN FINED FOR POSSESSION OF BEER

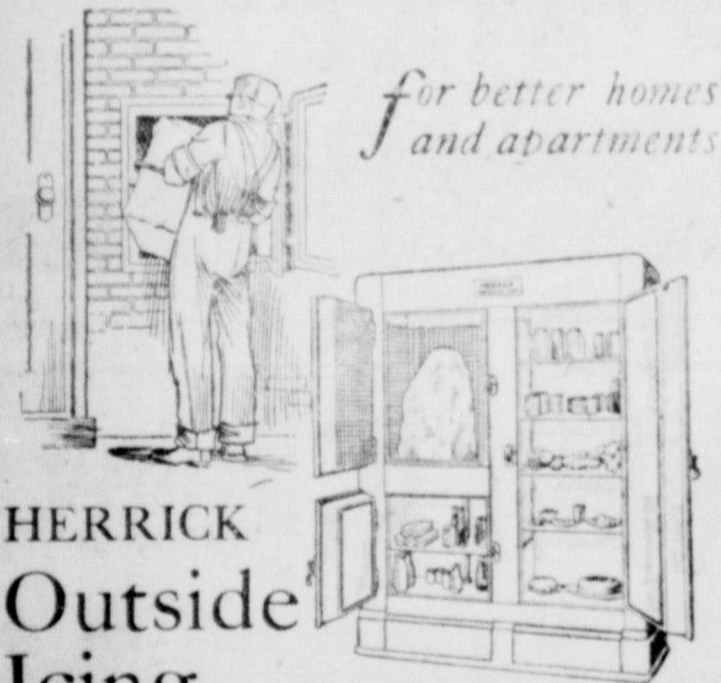
