

SEATTLE, May 2,-One hundred and thirty-five years ago Captain George Vancouver, British explorer, and Captain Robert Gray, an American, conducting expeditions of discovery for their respective countries, accidentally met off the Strait of Juan de

Commemorating the historic event, Gov. Roland H. Hartley of Washington and Premier John Oliver of British Columbia, as well as the mayors of Puget Sound and British Columbia Seattle today.

Capt. Gray turned his sloop "Columbia" to the south to disgover the great Columbia River and take possession of the territory for the United States. Capt. Vancouver passed through the strait to discover and name Puget Sound and to find that it was not the long sought Northwest Passage.

The waters which Vancouver discovered in 1792 have develsoped into one of the great trade arteries of the world. Twentyseven million tons of cargo moved last year through the Straits of Juan de Fuea.
