When marriage between Ferdinand and Princess Marie, claughter of Alfred, Duke of Edinburgh and later Duke of Saxe-Coburg, was talked of, it was said the Rumanian queen was much incensed and that MHe. Vacaresco felt it so keenly that she sent Ferdinand's love letters to Princess Marie. However, he married the latter January 10,

The royal couple had six children, one of whom died in childhood. The others were Crown Prince Carol, born in 1893; Princess Elizabeth, born in 1894, and married in 1921 to King George of Greece, who afterward abdiscated: Princess Marie, married to King Alexander of Jugoslavia; Prince Nicolas, and Princess
