ABILENE MAN WANTS A LINE TO AMARILLO.

J. F. Strother ,of Abilene, for the Midland & Northwestern Railroad, Tuesday suggested to the board of directors of the Gulf & West Texas Railroad that the latter road might be extended to Amarillo by the additional building of 66 miles of track and with the use of the Midland, Orient and Santa Fe roads.

This matter was brought before the board at its meeting in San Antonio Tuesday.

The plan as submitted by Strother would necessitate the building of only 66 miles of track between San Angelo and Amarillo. The route would include Rankin, Midland, Seminole and Seagraves.

SAN ANGELO, Aug. 10. -Judge W. C. Blanks, of San Angelo, secretary and treasurer of the Gulf & West Texas Railroad, has returned from San Antonio convinced that there is available \$1,250,000 in subscriptions to the common stock of the road.

"I am sure that the railroad will be built as planned, as I am of anything I have ever had any connection with," he said. "The men who are associated with San Angelo in this project are as interested in the railroad as we are, and are just as earnest. The men behind the movement have made up their minds that Corpus Christi, San Antonio and San Angelo should be connected by a short line road and we are going to build it."






