she was apparently about 500 miles east of the northeast tip of Newfoundland on her trip from Old Orchard, Maine to Rome, Italy, sent liners and warships

racing to her assistance. Beyond the fact that her crew, Lloyd Bertaud, James Hill and Phillip Payne, were in the grip of some tragedy over the trackless wastes of water, no details were given in the message.

Within a few minutes after receiving the distress call, several ships were rushing under full steam towards the estimated position of the monoplane.
