SILLIX WELL MAKING 200 BARRELS ON PUMP

Sillix et al McMillan No. 1 is good for more than 200 barrels of petroleum daily, owners of the well stated Wednesday after it had been placed on the pump and a short test given until 2:00 o'clock Wednesday morning when a wet belt on the pump caused a break and a delay for several hours.

During the past 11 hours ending at 6:00 o'clock Wednesday morning the well flowed and was pumped of 107 barrels of oil. The well now makes more than 200 barrels per day and will be left as it is.

H. A. McLean, one of the owners of the well, declared Wednesday afternoon that until the well failed to flow or make oil under the pump, it would never be deepened.

"We will not drill deeper until the flow stops or the well fails to make oil under the pump," Mr. McLean said. "At present the well is making more than 200 barrels in heads and under the pump and we will now let it bring in revenue."

Second Oil Shipment
The second shipment of Runnels county oil was made Tuesday afternoon when approximately 400 barrels of the Sillix oil was shipped in two cars from Benoit to Texas City over the Santa Fe. The first shipment was made a week ago.

28 AMERICANS ARE PLACED IN SOVIET JAILS

CONSTANTINOPLE, Sept. 28.—Twenty-eight employees of the American Near East Relief in Russian Armenia have been arrested by Soviet authorities, say advices received at the offices of the organization here today. A majority of those imprisoned were teachers in the American schools, the advices said. It was reported here that the Soviet authorities suspected the Americans of violating the decree which prohibits religious teaching to children.

ROGERS BELIEVES WIFE WAS INSANE LAST YEAR

CRIME GROWS FAST IN U. S.

(By Associated Press)
WASHINGTON, Sept. 28.—Crime, as evidenced by admissions to the state prisons, is growing faster than the population of the United States, figures announced today by the Census Bureau indicate. Complete returns from 31 states, covering 58 of the total of 91 state penitentiaries, listed 27,018 new prisoners were received by these institutions in 1926 as compared with 21,054 in 1925, the first year a prison census was taken. This tabulation shows an increase of 28 per cent.

The states which have received more than 1,000 inmates included Texas.

FORD'S BROTHER DIES SUDDENLY

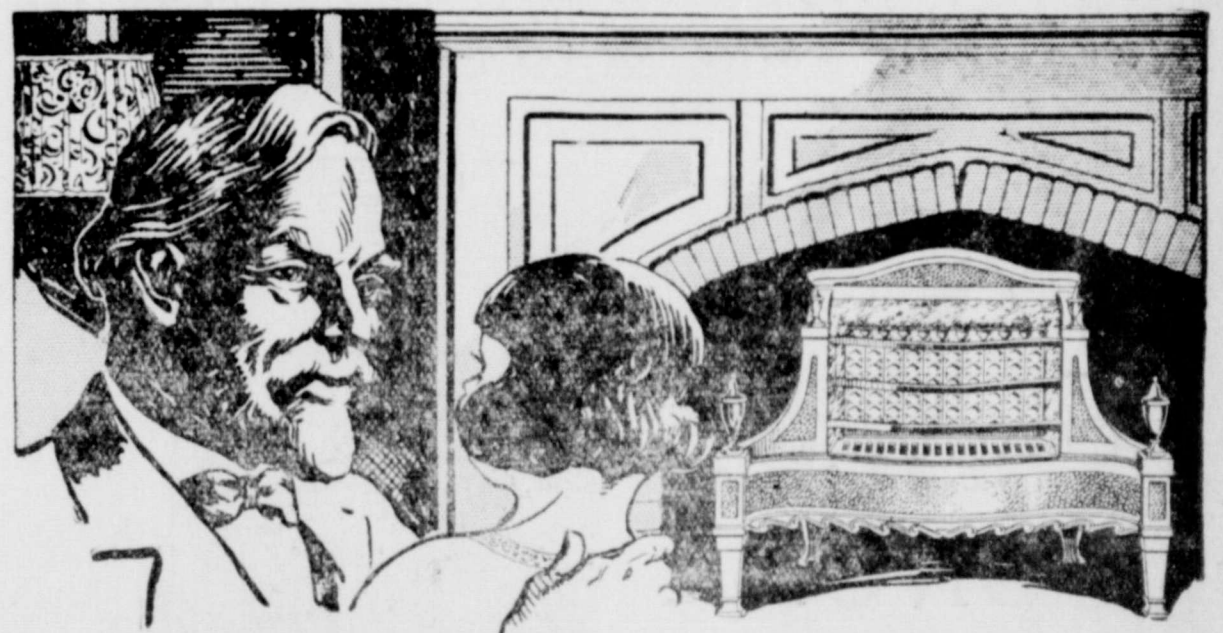

Ford, a real estate dealer and president of the Fordson city council, a member of the Michigan State Fair Board, was en route home from a council meeting when stricken.

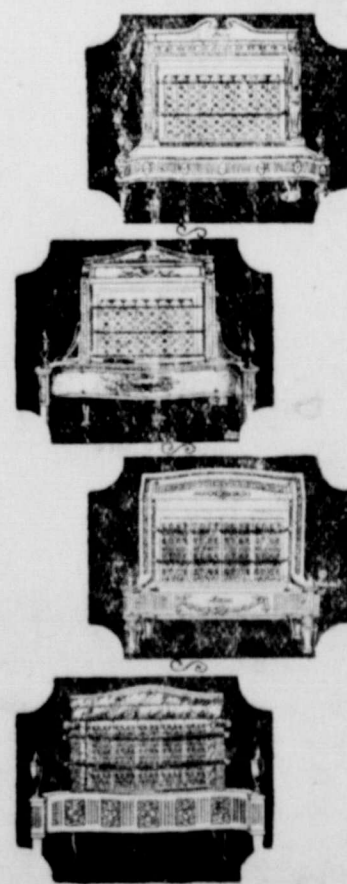
When Ford failed to reach home, police started a search, finding his body in a house that he had recently acquired.

Splendid Rains Fall Over Large Ranch-Farming Area

Rains that started falling Monday night in this section spread over the entire county Tuesday and Tuesday night, and in some localities moisture was still falling Wednesday. The precipitation will benefit greatly the small grain farmers, the ranchmen and citizens of this section in general.

Stockwater was getting low on some of the large ranches in this section and in a few instances ranchmen were on the verge of hauling water for their cattle and sheep but the rains which started this week have aided much.

Small grain will be greatly helped by this rain as the ground was rather dry and some who had already sown their grain for grazing purposes believed the crop would not come up without further rain. It will also enable other farmers to sow grain and get ready for a good winter season.

Grass in some parts of the range was dying fast and the moisture will give it renewed life and aid cattle and sheep.

The Colorado River was on a big rise Wednesday morning and at noon was still rising. Other streams, including Elm Creek, also were carrying flood waters and giving fresh stock water.

Busses of the West Texas Coaches and of Murphey's Line were running behind schedule Wednesday with several being cancelled and not in operation due to the bad roads.

Of the thirty-three communities and towns in nine counties of this section, reporting to the Ballinger office of the West Texas Telephone Company, each recorded good rains, ranging from half an inch at Crews and Hatchel to 3.25 inches at Millersview, where on Monday night a 5-inch rain also fell.

Ballinger received nearly two inches since moisture began falling here Tuesday, until 7:00 o'clock Wednesday morning.

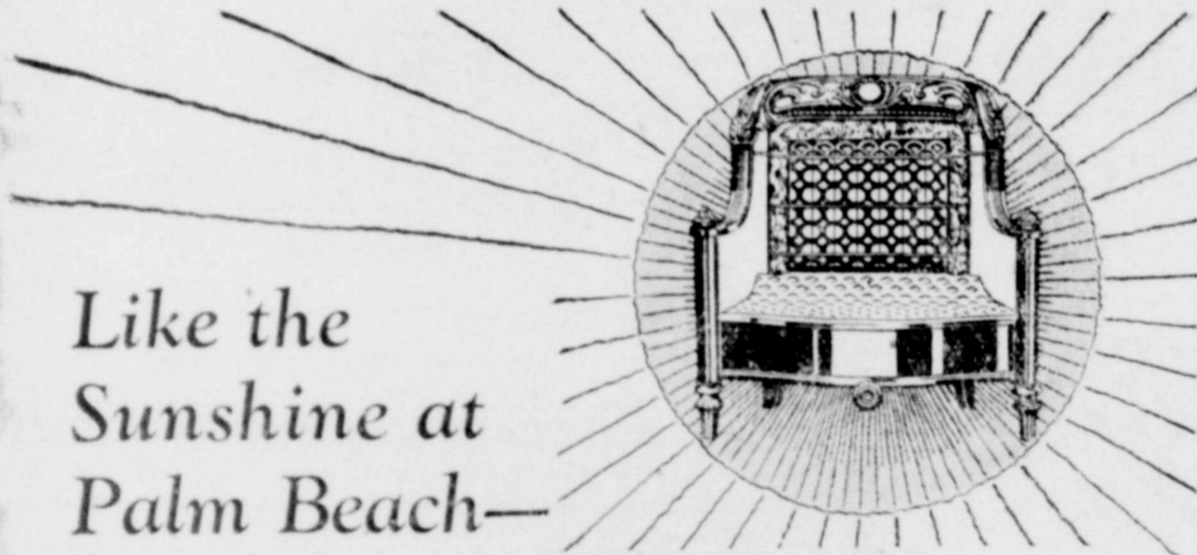
