A traffic ordinance has been adopted by the City Commission limiting parking to two hours from 9 a. m. to 9 p. m on Hutchings Avenue between Ninth and Seventh strets, and Eighth Street between Railroad and Strong Avenues, to take effect immediately. The ordinance was passed in view of the fact that there is a congestion of traffic in the city which is not properly regulated in the business district. A new traffic code supersedes former traffic ordinances.


