According to a telephone message from the Dallas office of the Associated Press at 3:45 Tuesday afternoon no tornadoes or cyclonic disbances had been reported from any point in Texas.

A 66-mile wind was reported from Abilene which did considerable damage. A roof and two walls were blown off the McMurry College gymnasium, which was the greatest damage reported. Sweetwater reported a similar wind with dust so dense that lights were turned on in all stores and residences. Lubbock seemed to be the center for rumors of a tornado, but A. P. wires were open to that city and no storm had been reported at a late hour this afternoon.
