Miss Ima McKown, county clerk, stated Friday that the time is at hand for candidates for county offices to file the first report of campaign expense accounts the first not more than 30 nor less than 25 days before the first primary election, the second no more than twelve nor less than eight days, and the third not more than ten days after the election. Candidates in the second primary will follow the same procedure for that election. Candidates for state and district offices must file records of campaign expenditures with the secretary of state; county and precinct candidates with the coun
