





After the 10th day of the month all customers who have not paid the preceding month's account will be cut off and a penalty assessed upon re-connecting. The only exception to this rule is on accounts headed "charity" by the water department. Why anyone would not want this rule enforced is hard to understand. If the city administration is to be conducted on businesslike basis, and we are sure that all loyal citizens wish it that way, accounts must be collected on all service rendered. With everyone paying for the water used the department will make money, stay out of debt, and be able to improve the system as it is needed. Yet, some people who are fully able to pay, will disregard their water bills and then get angry at some city employee when they find themselves cut off. If this happens to you remember that these employees are working under instructions and have no choice in the matter. The law says get the money or cut the water off and as long as the city operates on this basis the water department will be the source of good revenue. A discount large enough to be of benefit is offered to everyone who pays by the tenth of the month and if that is not incentive to pay just remember that there will be no water later.


ANOTHER FARM CRIME?
