Abilene Farmer Killed In Highway Accident

by an automobile and killed on Morrow to Ignore the highway 10 miles south of Abilene late Sunday afternoon.

W. D. Scales, who was returning with his family to Ballinger from Abilene, arrived at the scene about thirty minutes after the accident and assisted in taking the injured man to an Abilene hospital. The victim died in Mr. Scales' arms while en route to the hospital.

When Mr. Scales and family arrived at the scene half an hour after the accident the injured man was still lying on the pavement in a pool of blood, and nothing had been done for his relief. The family and others present were excited and had done nothing to relieve the victim's suffering. 


