Live-at-Home Credit Plan that the only basis for a permanent successful agricultural policy that will improve credit and Pope Preparing on the farmer living at home, we make the following recommendations to the bankers of Texas with reference to those farmers who must depend upon mortgages as a basis of credit:

First, the farmer's program must include the following:

(a) A sufficient number of milk supply of milk, butter and cheese for family consumption and a surplus to sell.
