

This was done in the name of the Lone Star Gas Company, the parent organization with general

offices at Dallas. As soon as work was started the company created an office and warehouse here and have continued in the same place since opening here. This building serves at present as the office. warehouse and merchandise store

The company fulfilled its agreement with the city and before cold weather was furnishing gas to most of the property in Ballinger. At the present time they have 860 meters in the city limits here and are giving excellent service.

The Community Natural Gas Company received its gas from the Lone Star Gas Company from the main line through a measuring station. This station is located on the Abilene highway a short distance north of the city limits. This station measures in cubic feet all the gas that is consumed by the Community Gas Company in this city. In addition to this station there are three regulator stations here that keeps the pressure even to the consumes.

Gas used here comes from Coleman and Brownwood fields but in case wells there should fail the system could be switched onto a trunk line and served from other places.

Garland Ranges, Estate Gas Heatrolas, Brilliant Fire Heaters, Ray-Glo Heaters and Stargas are some of the merchandise handled by the company. More than 40 Stargas plants and equipment have been installed and are serviced through the Ballinger office. Drums are furnished for these plants here and will be delivered at a small cost to the homes.

J. A. Schnable is local manager and an outside foreman, a utility man and a cashier are employed regularly here in addition to special men who work here weeks
