New Bidding Boon to Novice, Says Actress-Bridge Expert Somes &

NEW YORK, Nov. 30. (P)-Those players who cannot spend the time to become experts are the principal beneficiaries of the simplified system of bidding contract bridge which was adopted at the first general convention of bridge teachers in New York.

It is really a combination system, the best features of a number of well known systems being utilized in these new rules which should remove many obstacles for infrequent players:

First known as the "universal," it is now called the "official" system, being sponsored by nearly all well known bridge teachers with the exception of Ely Culbert-

The changes brought about in this new system are not complex. Under its rules, a one bid shows two and one-half tricks.
