Bearcat Goal Line Remains Uncrossed

Playing on a field covered with water and in a steady downpour of rain, the Ballinger Bearcats routed the Santa Anna Mountaineers by a score of 19 to 0 at Fair Park Friday afternoon.

Mud on the field made playing almost impossible and perhaps cut the score much smaller than it would have been.

The Bearcats opened the game with two plays on a comparatively dry field before rain began falling hard.

In the opening minutes of the second quarter the game took a turn in favor of the Bearcats when Flynt took the ball, dropped back and threw a well aimed pass 25 yards to Marsh who evaded two tacklers and ran 15 yards for a touchdown.

The teams fought the remainder of the half and the third period in the mud, water and slush, the locals lading in offensive until the middle of the fourth period before anything happened.

In the last few minutes of play Nelson went into the game for Marsh at halfback and on the first play dashed around right end for 20 yards, placing the ball on the 1-yard line.
