

MARITZBURG. Union of Sou Africa, Aug. 5.-Wool growers South Aferica have joined the wool men of the world in determined war against the progress of rayon and other fiber

products The seriousness of the position was emphasized when at the annual congress of the Natal and East Griqualand Wool Growers' Association, it was pointed out that from 1892 to 1934 the production of rayon had increased from 31,000 to 795,355,-000 pounds.

This campaign wil launch a gigantic publicity drive and funds will also be raised to start an extensive scientific research to discover new uses to which wool can be put
