

Insects and bad weather account for part of the fruit crop. Even so, fruit must be thinned by the grower. Thinning improves the size and quality of the fruit left on the tree, reduces the number of culls and increases the uniformity of ripening

This is the best time to thin peaches-when the fruit is about the size of the end of the thumb A second thinning may be needed two ar three weeks later. Sometimes an orchardist may thin from 600 to 1,200 peaches on a single tree. But he's not losing money in terms of pounds of fruit, since a tree wouldn't produce large fruit if it were not

The easiest way to thin fruit is to pull them off. On the higher branches, a six-foot stick with a piece of rubber hose 8 to 12 inches long attached makes a handy tool for fruit thinning, Rosborough says

For a few cents per tree, thinning the fruit increases the size of the fruit left, improves its quality and brings a higher price on the market.

**Results Announced** In Ysleta Station's **Cotton Variety Test** 

COLLEGE STATION, June 1.summary of the El Paso Valley cotton variety test for 1948 was recently released by P. J. Lyerly superintendent, G. F. Henry, ssistant cotton breeder and Lee S. Smith formerly assistant cotton breeder of the El Paso Valley experiment station, Ysleta.

A total of 22 varieties of cotton were included in the 1948 test. Twelve of these varieties have been tested at the station for three or more years and accordng to Lyerly the results from these tests are much more reliable than those from a single season

A comparable average yield per acre for the varieties tested three r more years shows Deltapine 15 eading with average yield of .243 pounds of lint per acre This varity also leads in per cent lint with an average of 39.6 er cent, but in fiber strength oll size and earliness, it ranks elow many of the other varieties

Other varieties in this group and their per-acre yield include antan Acala, 1,164; Coker Staple 55; Coker 100 WR, 1,115; Acala 517 WR. 1.142; Stoneville 2B, 1 95; Lentz Acala, 1,094; Acala 4-42 1,094; Acala 17-33, 1,080; Rogers Acala, 1,076; Empire WR P-43 ,072 and Mesa Acala 17-33, 1,00 pounds of lint per acre.
