#### Abstract

Today the U. S. oil industry will be called on to supply the States with $6,400,000$ barrels of U. S. oil. It supplied that United States with $6,400,000$ barrels of U. S. oil. It supplied that amount every day last week, and will supply it every day this week and next. It is a million barrels a day more than the peak of World War II, and it is $65 \%$ more than it was in 1940.

An increasing amount of today's oil goes to the needs of national defense, but the bulk of it supplies power for the millions of cars and trucks on American highways, the hundreds of thousands of tractors on American farms, and for the industriss that make al the things that add up to a high American standard of living

More cars, more tractors, more industries mean a need for more oil, year after year. This need has required the oil industry to look far ahead, to keep itself more than ready to supply current needs. It must be able quickly to meet increased demands.

And it is. Since World War II, U. S. oil companies have plowed back into the development of U. S. oil resources about


$\$ 8$ billion to find more oil, to increase oil production, to extend pipe lines and build tankers, to increase and improve refining capacity.
