

#### Friona, Bovina firefighters request aid from county Volunteer Fire Department and

The Parmer County Commissioners Court met in regular session on Monday, May 22 at the county courthouse in Farwell to discuss a lengthy agenda.

The current burn ban will be kept in place until the next commissioners meeting on Monday, June 12, 2017.

"The ban does not stop someone from burning but makes the point that if you plan to burn, call the Sheriff's Office to inform them of the location of the burn," stated Parmer County Judge Trey Ellis. "It is wheat harvest time and a fire could wipe out a field and a farmers livelihood."

Representatives from City of Friona, City of Bovina, Friona Bovina Volunteer Fire Department met with the commissioners concerning subsidies to the fire services offered in Parmer County. The entities were requesting additional funds for Friona and Bovina Volunteer Fire Departments. The commissioners tabled the issue until their budget workshop in July. They promised to include something for each service in the 2018 budget.

The commissioners approved the Inter-Local Agreement for E9-1-1 services and equipment through Panhandle Regional Planning Committee.

Art Chavez and Ray Parker of Washington National Insurance

addressed the commissioners concerning supplemental insurance for the county employees. No action was taken.

Friona ISD requested \$9,039.60 from the Permanent School Fund for security measures at the Primary building and portable classrooms. The commissioner approved the request.

The commissioners approved the purchase of a copier for the County Courtroom and safety equipment for the precincts. The safety equipment purchased were first aid kits for each County Barn and each motor grader.

In other business, the commissioners approved the use of the courthouse lawn during Border Town Days on July 29, 2017.

The commissioners tabled the proposed revisions to the Parmer County Policy Manual giving them time to study the changes until the next meeting in June.

Perdue, Brandon, Fielder, Collins & Mott were unable to attend the commissioners meeting so the collection report was tabled until June.

Sheriff Randy Geries reported that the population of the jail is 25 at this time.

The Commissioners will meet again on June 12, 2017 at 10 a.m. in the County Courtroom at the Parmer County Courthouse. All meetings are open to the public. The Commissioner's Court reserves the right to go into executive session at anytime.


#### Squaw fundraiser meal Sat. June 3



We have folks—scouts who are on the lookout for treasures in their travels. One such treasure is yearbooks. Mostly, we have Friona yearbooks and we have been fortunate enough to complete our collection through donations and such finds. However, we are also interested in yearbooks from all Parmer County Schools for our community partner—Parmer County Historical Museum. Yearbooks from Bovina, Farwell, Lazbuddie, Oklahoma Lane...were the object of this search.

One such 'find' a couple of years ago, a 1928 Chieftain Yearbook! It was very exciting because the earliest one we had was a 1929! Turns out it was from Pleasant Hill, NM, our neighbors to the west in Curry County, but it looks much the same format as our 1929 year-

Recently, one of our scouts found two more Chieftain Yearbooks, a 1948 and a 1949. Once again, they were from Pleasant Hill, but one was almost a mirror image of our own 1949 Chieftain yearbook! So, we did a little research (a library is such a nice place from which to do that!) in the 1978 Curry County History Book from our genealogy collection. The small community of Pleasant Hill, NM located between Texico and Hollene, and named by Les Barnes when it organized just after the turn of the century in 1906. Carved from the BROWN and CHENAULT ranches, Pleasant Hill took its name from Pleasant Hill, Texas, from Barnes' favorite memories and settled by a 'handful of homesteaders' for residents.

Education became the first priority for the residents as they established two subscription schools. First located in a shack and then upgraded to a chicken house and later a tent. Parents paid subscription schools tuition fees either monthly or quarterly in the neighborhood of 75 cents per quarter, per student--I sup-

By 1916 when the community had established a tax system, they built a two-story frame building and later added the stucco coating. They also built a teacherage, which included seven apartments for faculty housing (That is such an oldspell check).

By 1931, the community of Pleasant Hill had built a gymnasium for their organized sports,

which included softball, boys and girls, basketball, volleyball and track. Friona, Farwell and Bovina are among the communities they played against. Their teams were the Indians and the Squaws. Only their yearbook bore the name Chieftain. Other activities included Forensic, Literary Society, Debate, and Shop.







A friend of mine feels guilty and gets upset with herself because she falls asleep when she prays. I understand her frustration. Second, before you begin praying, ask God to help you focus and concentrate on Him and what He wants you to pray.

Third, as soon as you start falling asleep or your mind starts wandering, re-focus, get back into God's presence. The more you practice this, the faster it will become a habit. To be honest, I am writing this as much for myself as for anyone. I

pray at the track when I am walking, when I am driving, etc. There is nothing wrong with that, but it is not the quality prayer time I desire with God, or the quality time He desires with me.

Just like we can never out-give God, we can never spend too much time with God. Find out what works for you, and enjoy being present in His presence.





#### DPS enhances enforcement during Memorial Day weekend

The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) will join law enforcement efforts across the state during the Memorial Day weekend to help keep Texas roadways safe. From Friday, May 26, through Monday, May 29, DPS Troopers will be on the lookout for intoxicated drivers, and drivers violating speed limit, seat belt and other traffic laws.

"As we honor those who gave their lives to protect and serve our country, we are asking all drivers to help us prevent senseless tragedies on the roadways this holiday weekend," said DPS Director Steven McCraw. "Drive sober, wear your seat belt, slow down, obey traffic laws and use extra caution when you get behind the wheel this weekend. DPS and other law enforcement will do our part by watching for drivers who are violating the law and endangering the lives of other travelers."

During the Memorial Day holiday weekend last year, DPS Troopers issued more than 45,000 tickets and warnings, including

seat belt and child safety restraint citations. DPS enforcement efforts also resulted in 389 DWI arrests, 190 fugitive arrests and 175 felony arrests.

DPS also supports the state's "Click It or Ticket" enforcement campaign, which runs through June 4, to encourage drivers and passengers to comply with state seat belt laws.

Drivers can take a variety of measures to enhance safety on our roads this Memorial Day weekend, including:

Do not drink and drive.

Slow down - especially in bad weather, construction areas, heavy traffic and unfamiliar areas.

Eliminate distractions while driving, including the use of mobile devices.

Buckle up everyone in the vehicle – it's the law. In other words, "Click It or Ticket."

Don't drive fatigued - allow plenty of time to reach your destination.

Drive defensively, as holi-

day travel may present additional challenges.

Before your trip begins, make sure your vehicle is properly maintained and always double-check to make sure all cargo is secure.

Slow down or move over for police, fire, EMS, Texas Department of Transportation vehicles and tow trucks that are stopped on the side of the road with emergency lights activated - it's the law. Also, show the same courtesy to fellow drivers stopped along the road.

Monitor weather conditions wherever you are traveling. In the event of inclement weather, use extra caution on roadways, and never attempt to cross flowing streams or drive across flooded roadways. #### DPS urges Texans to stay vigilant, report suspicious activity

The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) is calling on Texans to remain vigilant regarding potential crime and terrorist suspicious behaviors to local authorities or iwatchtx.org. The iWATCH program was created as a partnership between communities and law enforcement, and utilizes citizen-sourced tips related to criminal activity.

"In the wake of the cowardly attack in Manchester, UK, our condolences go out to the victims and their families, and everyone impacted by this tragedy," said DPS Director Steven McCraw. "We want to remind Texans of the crucial role they play in helping law enforcement protect the public from groups and lone-wolf actors intent on harming others. We urge individuals to stay alert and report any illegal or suspicious activity they witness to iWATCH or to their local authorities."

In addition to the bombing in the UK, other terrorist and criminal attacks have taken place around the world, including here in the U.S.

Concerned citizens who observe suspicious activity can visit the iWATCH website www.iwatchtx.org - to fill out a report, which includes contact information and specifics about a particular incident. A report usually takes fewer than five minutes to complete, and once submitted, each report is reviewed by law enforcement analysts. To make an anonymous report, individuals can contact DPS at 1-844-643-2251. (iWATCH is not designed to report emergencies. If a situation requires an emergency response, call 911.)

Preparations for terrorist attacks may often be seen, but rarely reported. When in doubt, please speak up. Here are some ex-

amples of behaviors and activities to report: Strangers asking questions about building security features and procedures.

Briefcase, suitcase, backpack or package is left behind.

Cars or trucks are left in no-parking zones at important buildings.

Chemical smells or fumes that are unusual

People requesting sensitive information,


such as blueprints, security plans or VIP travel schedules, without a need to know.

Purchasing supplies that could be used to make bombs or weapons, or purchasing uniforms without having the proper credentials.

Taking photographs or videos of security features, such as cameras or checkpoints.

Reports to iWATCH can also be made through the DPS Mobile App. The app is currently available for iPhone users on the Apple App Store: (https://itunes.apple.com/ us/app/texas-dps/id902092368?mt=8) and for Android users on Google Play: (https:// play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=com. microassist.texasdps&hl=en).

The iWATCH website is part of the DPS Intelligence and Counterterrorism Division, which serves as the central clearinghouse for the collection, management, analysis and dissemination of law enforcement and homeland security intelligence in Texas. The DPS intelligence strategy is essential to proactive, preventive and effective law enforcement operations to combat crime and terrorism.
