# Help keep children safe as new school year begins

As we embark on the new school year, the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) cautions Texans to watch for children who are walking to and from school or waiting for buses. Drivers should be especially alert and careful around school buses – which make frequent stops - and always follow traffic laws regarding school buses contact Kathryn Rector or the Chamber and school zones. "As school districts across Texas start classes in the coming days in Friona. and weeks, drivers should slow down and be alert when school children and buses are present," said DPS Director Steven McCraw. must be submitted at the same time as the "Obey school zone speed limits and stop for school buses when required. Individuals who disregard the law and illegally pass stopped Kathy Rector at (806) 577-6130 or Erika school buses needlessly put children in harm's way – and face significant traffic fines."

The moments when students are entering or exiting a bus can be one of the most dangerous times during a child's trip on a school bus. Accordingly, DPS urges drivers to slow down and pay close attention in school zones, since children may unexpectedly step into a roadway without checking for oncoming traffic.

State law requires that approaching drivers stop when a bus is stopped and operating a visual signal – either red flashing lights or a stop sign. Drivers should not proceed until the school bus resumes motion; the driver is signaled by the bus driver to proceed; or the visual signal is no longer activated. A driver does not have to stop for a school bus that is operating a visual signal if it is on a highway with roadways separated by an intervening space or physical barrier. (If a highway is divided only by a left-turning lane, the roadways are not considered separated, and drivers must stop for school buses.)

As a reminder, school buses, by law, must stop at all railroad cross-

Drivers who illegally pass school buses face fines up to \$1,250 for the first offense, and potential criminal charges if they cause serious bodily injury to another. For individuals convicted of this offense more than once, the law allows the individual's driver license to be suspended for up to six months. (A ticket for illegally passing a school bus cannot be dismissed through defensive driving.)







An often popular and quoted verse of scripture is Psalm 46:10, "Be still, and know that I am God." Maybe you've seen this verse on shirts, cups or devotionals, and is often the comfort verse in any situation for folks to just calm down and chill out. In fact, Sarah Young's popular devotional series, "Jesus Calling", uses this as a theme verse, and calls you to be a 'listener' to the messages God wants to give you and help fulfill a deeper yearning for something more than scripture. Further, this verse is foundational to Christian mystics to reach a false conclusion that they are god, which is what the verse says, right? Wrong!

This is no doubt a special, sacred and inspired verse from the spirit of God, but its use is usually a case of bad exegesis. Exegesis deals with properly interpreting scripture in context, and not coming to false conclusions by pulling out favorite phrases. The truth of this scripture is not for you to take a chill pill and just "Be still," but when you read the entire verse you see that God is making clear that He is exalted and sovereign over His creation. All of Psalm 46:10 says, "Be still, and know that I am God. I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth." In other words, settle down in your striving and anxiety and take a minute to gaze at God's power and glory. When we set our sights on His greatness, there is a peace and joy in knowing our Sovereign, loving God, who is with us through our troubles and over them as well..




