SH 86 bridge maintenance project Motorists traveling on SH 86 , in Parmer County, over the next few
months can expect traffic to be reduced to months can expect traffic to be reduced to one-lane as the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) begins work on a $\$ 1.04$ million bridge maintenance project near the city of Bovina. Project contractor Earth
Builder, L.P., of Decatur, Texas, began work on Monday September. 18 Builder, L.P., of Decatur, Texas, began work on Monday, September. 18 .
Extended lane closures are planned for the duration of the project with SH 86 reduced to one lane and traffic flow controlled by portable, timed traffic signals. Speeds in the work zone will also be reduced; delays are likely, said Steve Perez, P.E., TxDOT's Littlefield Area engineer oversee ing the project.
During construction, speed limits in the work zone will be reduced by 10 mph . Motorists are asked to drive with caution through the work zone, be on the lookout for workers and avoid distractions for their own safety and the safety of the workers, Perez added.
