# Texas economy adds 34,700 positions in May

# State has experienced 23 consecutive months of employment growth

AUSTIN - The Texas economy added 34,700 seasonally adjusted nonfarm jobs in May, which marked 23 consecutive months of employment growth. Over the year, Texas added 352,100 jobs for an annual employment growth rate of 2.9 percent. Private-sector employers added 34,300 positions over the month. Texas' seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.1 percent in May, unchanged from April 2018.

"Texas employers continue to put the world class Texas workforce to work, adding 34,700 jobs in May and 352,100 over the year," said Texas Workforce Commission Chairman Andres Alcantar. TWC continues to work with our local and Tri-Agency partners to foster innovative strategies to equip the

Texas talent pool with industry aligned skills. Job creation is strong in Texas."

May's annual growth in the state's Goods Producing industries was strong at 5.7 percent. Over the month, the Construction industry added 5,800 jobs, followed by Mining and Logging with 4,100 positions, while Manufacturing employment expanded by 3,400 positions.

In Texas' Service Providing sector, Education and Health Services added 8,100 positions over the month, and led all industries in job growth for May. Also within this sector, Professional and Business Services added 4,300 jobs, followed by Leisure and Hospitality with a gain of 3,500 positions.

"Employers continue to contribute to








# Ever forward, but slowly

This Father's Day marked the demolition of the house my dad built for my mom with his own hands in the mid 1940's. Recently, all parties involved decided that demolition was the only solution to the problem of vandalism and thievery. My biggest regret was not saving my mom's piano. Its legs were amputated, followed by evisceration of its guts, and the slow and painful removal of its soul - for someone's entertainment, I suppose.

The year I retired, we cleaned out my grandma's house on 6th and Woodland. It was a lot of work cleaning out two school rooms and an entire house in a month's time. That house was also demolished. In both instances, locked doors and boarded windows just posed a dare . . . I suppose. As my sister and I examined one vandalism incident, we spied several names graffiti-fied on the walls. I recognized one of the names and handwriting. (A student of mine.) Although I could contact the parents, I haven't, knowing they already suffer a broken heart. My sister, who is from another part of the world, was outraged that someone would write "Jesus" on the walls, but I'm pretty sure he wasn't expressing his religious preference!

Such a contrast to my mom's family, who owned three small houses in town. When the owners died, they sold each house, also built by family members. Those three houses still stand today. Good sturdy homes, embellished by the new owners to create memories of their

I'm not sharing this to gain sympathy, to place or accept blame . . or shame. If you know me, you know there's a purpose for this message. Not just a true confession or a little TMI. Doing my best with my dad's house all these years has given me comfort, teaching me that there are borders in our lives, borders between what we can handle and what we can't, and we can find peace in that, even if we are the only ones who understand where those boundaries lie.

How sad, folks, when we hold on to reminders of the past so long that they deteriorate and lose their value. Until those memories no longer seem sweet, but leave us with sadness and bitterness and regret. How much better to save a few temporal objects along with the beautiful memories they represent, then pass the rest along to someone else?

Memories are things from the past. They should be honored, but not relived. Teach your daughter to make your mom's favorite cobbler; plant sunflowers, which your mother-in-law adored. Take the kids fishing at your dad's favorite lake. Speak respectfully to your children about their father, even though you have parted ways. Have a good laugh about some mischief you and your ex-best friend enjoyed. But don't expect to relive those days.

Fairly often, I hear someone say, "I just want to remember him the way he was." That's a luxury not everyone can afford. Someone has to tend to the elderly, dying parent, to deal with the messiness of the present. Not everyone can pause their memories at the prettiest scene.

Hopefully, I'm through cleaning out old houses. But I can use this lesson when I remember lost loved ones, lost relationships, or even precious times gone by. Expecting those experiences to remain unchanged or trying to replicate them drains the good out of them. Keep the best parts, demolish the worst, and move forward. Ever forward, but slowly. And Happy Father's Day to all the good dads and granddads out there, wherever you may be.



# Flashbacks from the Friona Archives of 1969

#### January 2nd -

Freddie Williams is killed in Vietnam. Word was received Saturday morning by Mr. and Mrs. T.A Williams of the death of their son SP/4 Freddie Williams, Friday, January 3 at Cu Chi, Viet Nam. An official telegram was received by the soldier's parents which stated that he died as a result of wounds received while in unit mess hall when an unknown type of explosion was detonated. Williams was born January 31, 1950 and attended the local schools before entering the United States Army in May of 1967. He had been in Vietnam about nine months.

### March 6th -







# **Parmer Paws Answers Your Questions**

by Pam Kendrick

After visiting with both Bovina and Friona city councils, we realize people have many questions about animal rescue and issues regarding animal ownership. Here are a few.

Where do we get all the anihals? Most are strays that have been picked up by the city. Don Spring, a volunteer from Bovina, says that many country folks dump off their unwanted critters in town, while town folks take theirs out to the country. It's a revolving door. Other animals are surrendered by people who cannot take care of them, and I used to believe that was cruel until I had to take care of emaciated, neglected, and injured animals whose owners felt too judged to surrender or didn't know they could. If you have animals that you do not want or cannot care for, the city would prefer you call for help instead of dumping them or opening your gate to let them escape.

Everybody's animals get out sometimes. We call those our little Houdinis. If you have a digging dog, lay chain link or fence panels down under and

inside your fence about three doned on highways, and left feet on each side. Most dogs won't know to back up three feet and tunnel under the obstruction. You can even plant grass on top of these. Storms the inside of your fence, and can frighten pets and blow even padlock if needed. Secopen gates. Fireworks are also ond, chip your animal. Most scary for animals. Be sure your vets can do this for you, but if gates fasten securely and provide safe shelter during storms and fireworks season. If your animal goes missing, contact the city office, check the city website, look on our Facebook page, or contact us at parmerpaws1@gmail.com. You will need to provide a description of the animal and proof of vaccination. You have seven days after your pet is picked up to claim, after which the animal is transferred or rehomed. AL-WAYS make sure your pet has ID tags and even write your phone number on the collar in case the tag is lost.

Tragically, there are people who steal animals out of your fenced yard, remove the tags, and dump them in someone else's yard, sometimes in another town. We have seen puppies thrown in dumpsters, locked in suitcases, aban-

chained at Walmart. It is unconscionable, but it happens. Two suggestions: First, be sure your gates lock down low on yours doesn't, call the city and Parmer Paws can help. The cost is usually about \$10 for the chip, and then you go online and activate the chip for about \$20 per year or about \$65 for the life of the pet. Most shelters, pounds, and vets have electronic chip readers that will identify the pet as yours and you will be contacted if your animal is found. Several years ago a dog in Friona was identified as belonging to a family in Tennessee!

Another way to keep your dog from wandering is to have it spayed or neutered. This can be expensive, but Parmer Paws can help. There are \$50 vouchers available through Amarillo SPCA and the Humane Society of Amarillo to have your dog fixed at Lonestar Veterinary Clinic or Hope Veterinary Clinic in Amarillo. Contact your city office, Parmer Paws, or the places mentioned above for more information. Additionally, Parmer Paws and Dr. Gary Cash will be hosting low-cost vaccination clinics soon. We will also offer chipping. Take advantage of these opportunities to save some money and protect your animals.

Parmer Paws is dedicated to making sure all good animals have good homes and all good homes have good animals! Your membership helps. 




