Baptist to Hear Noted Preacher

Baptist church members from across thirteen counties of North Texas will gather at the Red River camp near Vernon Sept. 15 to hear one of America's most noted preachers, Dr. S. M. Lockridge from San Diego, Calif. The program will begin at 7:30.

Dr. Lockridge preached in the major cities of Rhodesia, Africa, in 1968, and in the Caribbean in 1969 where he preached in fourteen Crusade of the Americas rallies. He was recently featured on the program of the Southern Baptist Convention in New Orleans.

A native Texan, he is a graduate of Bishop College and Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. For 17 years he has been pastor of Calvary Baptist Church in San Diego.

The Baptist rally at which Dr. Lockridge will be the featured speaker will be preceded by a Bible conference in the First Baptist Church, Vernon. Dr. Virtus Gideon, professor of New Testament at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary will be guest Bible teacher. The Epistle of James will be the subject of the study from 10 a. m. to 12 noon
