Austin, Tex.—The first of major reform bills before the 63rd Legislature — strengthening of "open meetings" requirements — has reached the desk of Gov. Dolph Briscoe.

The House quickly accepted Senate amendments, sending the measure (HB 3) on to the Governor.

Meanwhile, the Senate passed a version of the "shield bill" to protect newsmen's sources of information from state disclosure — except on State Supreme Court order. The Senate revision providing that citizens may bring mandamus

May 15th Is Final Date to Graze Set-Aside

Haying or grazing is permitted under the 1973 program provided the county office is notified and the fields designated prior to the haying or grazing.

This is the word to Foard County landowners issued this week by the Foard County ASCS office. Mrs. Jean Reeder, executive director of the ASCS office, says that May 15 is the final date to graze set-aside. Harvesting guar on set-aside is permissible with a reduction in payment, she added.

Cotton Production Figures Needed at ASCS Office

With the cotton harvest practically complete in Foard County after one of the longest, most-delayed harvest periods on record, Mrs. Jean Reeder, executive director of the Foard County ASCS office, told farmers that cotton production figures are needed now. She added, "Please bring in your production as soon as you complete harvest. Your 1973 payment yields cannot be established until we have this information."
