30 YEARS AGO

News items below were taken from the Thursday, August 26, 1943, issue of The Foard County News:

A wheat acreage of 65,690 acres next year, compared to 44,240 acres during 1943, is the new wartime production job for Foard County farmers, according to J. D. Miller, AAA administrative officer. Farmers may sow their 1944 wheat crop without regard to allotments, as none will be established for next year.

New oak pews have recently been placed in the new native stone church building in Truscott, it was announced here Saturday by the pastor, Rev. Joe W. English.

The Crowell school year 1943-44 will open on Monday morning, Sept. 6, according to an announcement made by Supt. I. T. Graves.

The first bale of cotton ginned from the 1943 crop was brought to Crowell Monday of last week, August 16, by O. O. Gilliam of the Good Creek community and it was ginned at the Crowell Gin. He brought a second bale to the gin on Tuesday. Ebb Scales, manager of the gin, bought both bales paying 17 1/2 cents per pound for the lint and \$50 per ton for the seed.

Coastal and Coastercross-1 Bermudas make fine pasture grasses, but getting top quality and production consistently will require planning. One way to do this is to base the stocking rate on minimum production periods (spring and fall) rather than on summer's profuse growth. Otherwise, overgrazing might result during slow growth periods, and supplement feeding could become necessary.

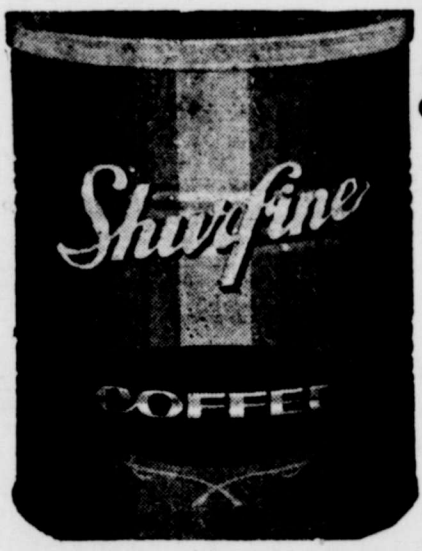
