Gillespie to come by the respective offices at his earliest convenience and render such property for the purpose of taxation.

    The law, in effect, provides that all property shall be listed or rendered by the owner thereof, if he is of full age and of sound mind, but when it becomes necessary for the respective tax assessors, their deputies or others who have to be hired for such purpose to seek out each property owner to secure the individual renditions, the expense involved is greatly increased, and this udditional expense is borne by the taxpayers.
