Telephone equipment that provides direct distance dialing for General Telephone customers in Crowell is nearing completion according to G. F. Kehoe, district manager. Kehoe stated the direct distance dialing equipment has been installed and is being tested for

Kehoe said all customers in Crowell will be required to give their number to the operator when they dial long distance calls. These customers, Kehoe said, should dial 1 plus (the area code if different from their own) and the number being called.

When the operator requests your number on a 1 plus call, this does not make it an "operator handled" call which is more costly than a station to station call, according to Kehoe.
