AUSTIN—As though every coffee drinker didn't already know it, the price of their favorite beverage is still playing havoc with many food budgets, as evidenced in the eighth monthly market basket survey compiled by the Texas Department of Agriculture.

"If it weren't for the continuing increase in the price of coffee, up another 47 cents for April in our survey, average prices throughout the state would have been down slightly for the 20 commonly purchased items. As it is, the total state average increased by 39 cents to \$19.89 in a month's time," Agriculture Commissioner Reagan V. Brown reported.

Totals tabulated on a city-by-city basis generally reflect the rise in coffee costs, Brown said. San Antonio, which maintained its position as the least expensive survey city, rang in a tab of \$19.02 in comparison to \$18.52 in March. McAllen/Edinburg remained in the cellar with its total market basket price of \$20.67, up some 50 cents from March.

Coffee Keeps on Climbing; Sharp Rise Shown in April

In upcoming weeks, Texas food shoppers can expect increased supplies of several fresh vegetables, including onions, cabbage, cucumbers, and carrots, now being harvested in the Rio Grande Valley.

Other Texas cities surveyed, in order of their total market basket tab with comparisons to March, include: Austin, \$19.30 in April compared to \$19.17 in March; El Paso, \$19.48 to \$19.56; Laredo, \$19.49 to \$19.15; Lubbock, \$19.66 to \$19.78; Abilene, \$19.85 to \$19.36; Fort Worth, \$19.95 to \$19.63; Tyler, \$19.96 to \$19.44; Dallas, \$20.01 to \$19.71; Houston, \$20.15 to \$20.06; and Corpus Christi, \$20.60 to \$19.63.

Foods purchased in the survey, their average statewide prices, and comparisons to March are: one gallon one-half per cent low fat milk, \$1.39 to \$1.41; one gallon whole homogenized vitamin D milk, \$1.64 both months; one dozen grade A large eggs, \$.78 to \$.81; 12 ounce package individually wrapped American cheese slices, \$1.30 both months; one pound margarine, \$.54 to \$.53; and 24 ounce white sandwich loaf bread, \$.42 to \$.41.

Also, one pound whole fryer chicken, \$.53 to \$.51; one pound regular ground beef, \$.78 both months; one pound grain-fed round steak with bone, \$1.44 to \$1.41; six and one-half ounce can light chunk tuna, \$.69 to \$.68; one pound bacon, \$1.23 both months; and one pound Red Delicious apples, \$.48 both months.

Also, 18 ounce box corn flakes, \$.74 to \$.72; one pound dry pinto beans, \$.24 both months; 49 ounce box detergent, \$1.46 to \$1.44; and six ounce can frozen orange juice, \$.29 to \$.28.

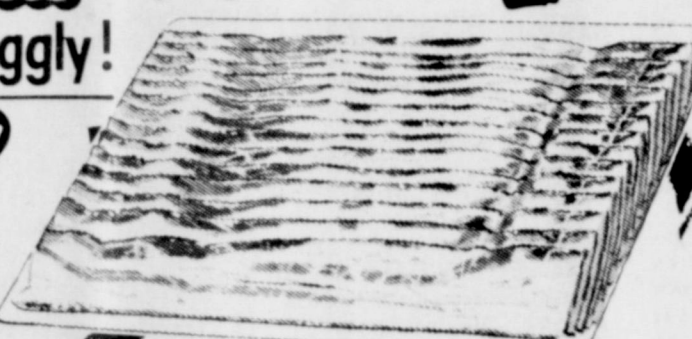
