years, the former D & H Supermarket building on Lockwood Street, is in the home stretch of a total remodeling job and will house Perry's Variety Store, a new business in Tahoka.

everything from sauce pans to school supplies." It will be a general variety store and will sell ladies' lingerie, piece goods, etc.

Ten employees will be on hand for the August 15 Grand Opening and four or

five people will be employed full time, said Bryant.

Mr. and Mrs. Phil Jennings, residents of Tahoka since 1963, are the proprietors of Jennings of Tahoka, a firm which will sell piece goods, linens, and both men and women's jeans, shirts, and coats.

Jennings is a Springlake native and is employed by Pioneer Gas Company in Tahoka. Mrs. Jennings, a native of Vega, has had a fabric shop near her home for three years, that business to be taken into the new one.

The building, on West Lockwood, is nearing completion and will contain 1,748 square feet, 1,100 square feet being occupied by Jennings of Tahoka and 648 by Sentry Shoes.

Mr. and Mrs. Jack Roseberry are owners of the shoe store and will be selling sport and casual shoes for the entire family.

The Roseberrys have been

in Tahoka for some twenty years. He is an electrician and has a plumbing and air conditioning business. Mrs. Roseberry owns Togs and Curis, a dress shop and beauty salon, next door to the new building.

Both Jennings of Tahoka and Sentry Shoes will be open the first week in August.

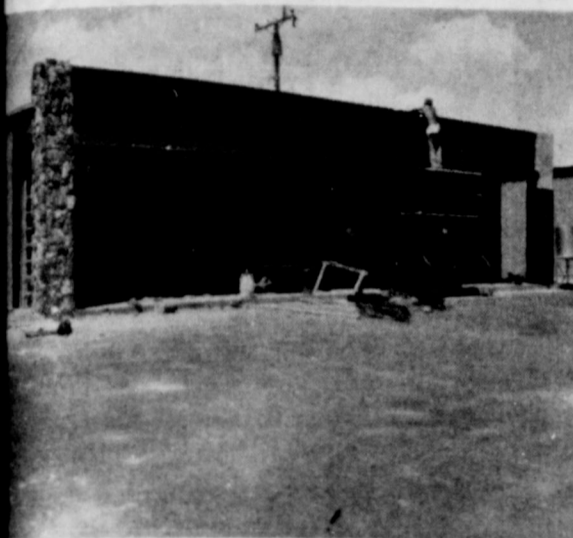

and publishers of *The Lynn County News*. Both he and she are graduates of Ropesville High School and he attended South Plains College at Levelland.

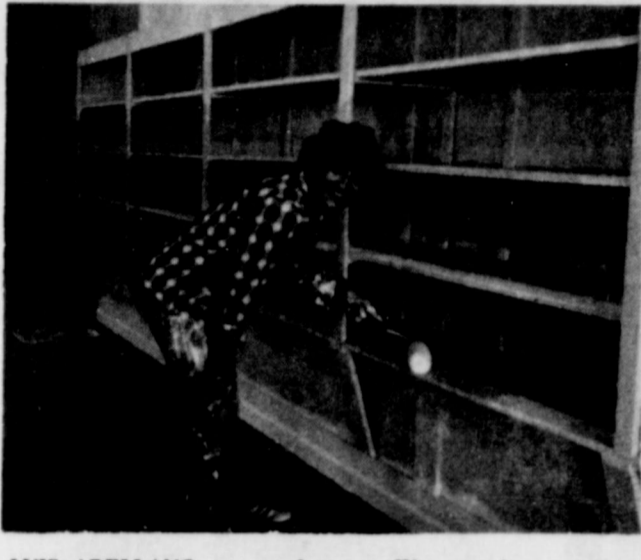
Western Auto, in its new location, will have automotive parts, tires, appliances, electronic equipment, sporting goods, paint, office supplies, etc.

## Beef Check-Off Program Is Vetoed In Lynn County

A national referendum on a beef check-off program, designed to raise \$30 million to \$40 million annually by taxing each cattle producer thirty cents for every \$100 received when cattle were

sold for slaughter, failed in Lynn County and the nation last week.

In the county, forty-seven producers registered at the ASCS office in June and, following a two-week waiting period, thirty-four voted. Sixteen voted for the program, and eighteen voted against it.

The Beef Research and Information Act, Public Law 94-294, was signed by the President on May 28, 1976. (see *Beef*, page 3)

## Interest Rate To Be Lower At Land Bank

Jay Dee House, manager of the Federal Land Bank Association of Tahoka, announced this week that the Federal Land Bank of Houston will reduce the interest billing rate on variable rate loans to 7-3/4%.

The reduction will be effective August 1st, and will affect \$1.04 billion in variable rate loans to 18,026 farmers and ranchers. The billing rate change will be effective on both farm loans and rural residence loans.

The variable rate loan was introduced by the Houston Bank in July, 1969 and provides for the rate to fluctuate with the variation in the cost of money. A more favorable money market has made this billing reduction

## Prolonged Hot, Dry Weather Has Effect On Cotton Crop

"We need a two-inch rain today, to make the cotton recover from the effects of the drought," County Agent Bill Griffin told *The News* on Tuesday of this week.

Although isolated spots in the county have received small amounts of moisture, vegetation is suffering badly and cotton is shedding its fruit.

According to Griffin, the evaporation rate is .4 to .5 percent per inch of moisture, depending on the temperature.

Specialists say that unless it rains immediately, the

Plains (from Big Spring, north) will lose 50,000 bales of cotton per-day between August 1st and 15th.

Some cotton has a good appearance, said Griffin, because it revived after it first shed fruit, due to lack of moisture.

Approximately 65,000 acres of irrigated cotton in the county, some being watered the second time, is in excellent condition. The dryland cotton which was planted solid is suffering more than the skip-row planting.

public on Saturday from 12 noon to 6 p.m. and on Sunday from 1 to 6 p.m.

Harrington Station is the first generating plant on Southwestern's system to use coal as its primary fuel. The first unit, rated at 356,700 kilowatts, was put into service in mid-1976 and is using about 3500 tons of coal per day. During some of the summer months, this consumption will be in excess of 4000 tons per day.

The second generating unit at Harrington is under

construction and is about fifty percent complete. It is scheduled to go on the line next summer and will also have a capability of 356,700 kilowatts. Construction of the third unit of the same

size will begin in the next few weeks and is scheduled for completion in 1980. All three of the Harrington generating units will use coal-fired boilers. (see *Harrington*, p. 3)

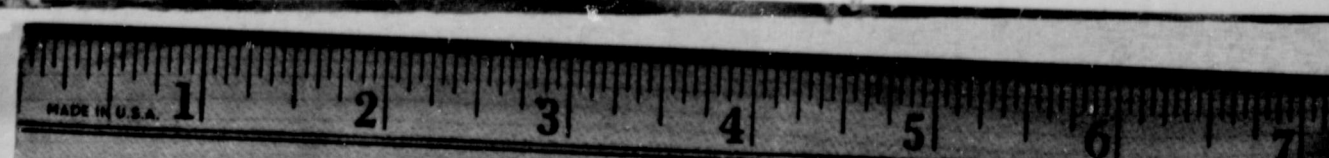

The coal used at Harrington Station is low-sulphur western coal, mined and brought in by unit train from Gillette, Wyoming. The trains have about 110 cars and are designed and built specifically to haul coal. Each train brings about 11,000 tons of coal to the plant on a twice-a-week schedule.

The design, engineering, and construction supervision was done by Southwestern's own generating plant design department, under the direction of Jim Matthews, manager, generation and design construction. Missouri Valley Constructors, Inc. of Amarillo was the mechanical and structural contractor and Budwine Electric Service Company of Carlsbad, New Mexico was the electrical contractor.

J. B. Bottoms was the resident engineer for Southwestern Public Service Company during the construction of the first unit, and Jerry Hermesmeier is the plant manager. Bottoms will also serve as resident engineer for construction of the second unit.

Harrington Station was named in honor of the late Don Harrington, Amarillo oilman, investor, and philanthropist. He served continuously on the SPS board of directors from the time the company was organized in its present form in 1942 until his death on April 27, 1974.

authorizing a nationally coordinated research and information program to improve, maintain, and develop markets for cattle, beef, and beef products. It gave the Secretary of Agriculture responsibility for determining if cattle producers really wanted to establish, finance, and operate such a program.

"Many of the cattlemen, on a national scale, who supported the program failed to take the time to register and vote," said George Strathearn, vice-chairman of the National Beef Development Task Force. "Others voted no because they were told the government would run the program, which was false, or because they were told it would be difficult for those who did not want to participate to get a refund, which was also not true," he said.

The proposal was defeated in all key cattle-producing states except Oklahoma, where 75.2 percent favored the program.

A 66 percent approval was needed for the referendum to carry, and top producing states where the proposal failed were Texas, 61.6 percent; Kansas, 60.3; Nebraska, 63.7; Iowa, 41.2; and Tennessee, 18.8.

### Students Tell Of Boys State

Richard Cranford and Jayson Knox, both seniors in Tahoka High this fall, and George Glenn, Tahoka American Legion Post commander, were speakers at the Rotary Club last Thursday noon.

Glenn told something of the Legion project, Boys State, and the Auxiliary project, Girls State, in Texas whereby young people get training for responsible American citizenship. LOW-SULPHUR WESTERN COAL is the fuel for Southwestern Public Service Company's Harrington Station. Located northeast of Amarillo, Harrington is the newest plant on Southwestern's system and the first to burn coal. The fuel is mined in Gillette, Wyoming and delivered to the plant in 110-car unit trains on a twice-a-week schedule.



THE CONTROL CENTER at SPS's Harrington Station keeps the operators informed about every phase of the operation of the turbine-generator, boiler, and auxiliary equipment. Closed circuit television keeps an eye on the water level and the fire in the boiler. The entire plant is operated by the latest digital computers.



THE ELECTRIC GENERATOR at Southwestern Public Service Company's new Harrington Station is rated at 356,700 kilowatts, the equivalent of 478,000 horsepower. The turbine rotates at 3600 rpm and its speed is controlled so that it is constant, within one revolution per day. This amazing accuracy keeps electric clocks on time and is used by industry for precision control of production operations. The generator output is 22,000 volts which is then stepped up by a transformer to 230,000 volts for more efficient power transmission.

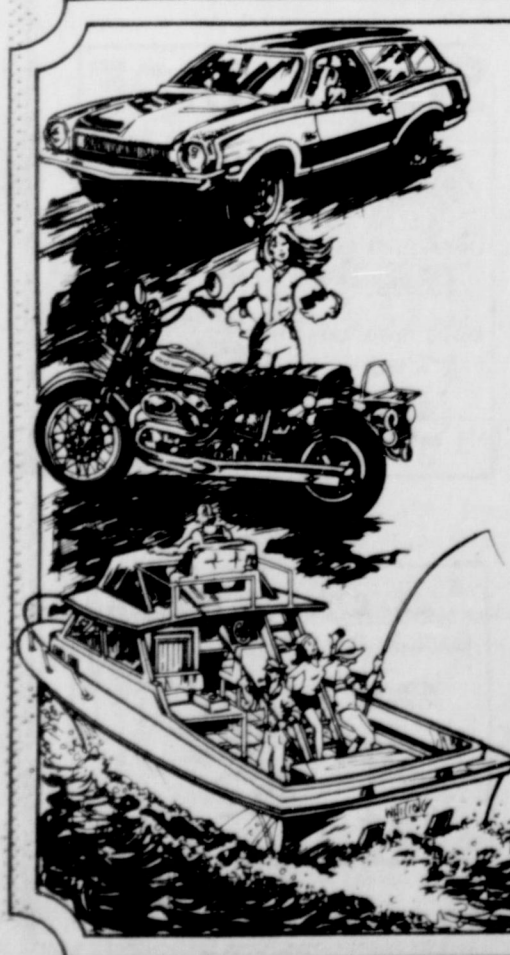
