CHICAGO MARKET LETTER. Improving a Little—Supplies Decreasing—Fat Stock Show—Tail Wagging the Dog.

UNION STOCK YARDS, CHICAGO, Nov. 9, 1885. Regular Correspondence Texas Live Stock Journal.

The market for range cattle has lately been rather quiet, but values have improved, especially on good to choice Texas cattle. Realizing that the season for grass cattle is practically over the canners and dressed beef men have lately been taking more interest than they seemed to have during the times of plenty. Supplies of cattle from the range countries have been decreasing, but farmers in all parts of the country are hastening to market with half and three-quarter fat cattle, which they are getting rid of.

Just at present the principal interest is centering about the great American Fat Stock and Dairy Show. Such a display of fine stock and dairy products has seldom, if ever before, been seen, and the attendance of stockmen at this time is very large. The sheep market remains much the same as for some time past. Each week there is more or less fluctuation in values, but the ups and downs have been about equal. But few Southwestern sheep are coming to market. The receipts from the farming districts continue large, and many farmers are culling out and marketing sheep which

are really not fit for saving through the winter. There is a large increase in the volume of dressed mutton shipments to the East, while the shipments of sheep on the hoof are decreasing very largely.

J. H. Campbell sold lately for W. S. Ikard a string of 906 pound Texans at \$3 25. Mr. Ikard has the distinction this year of marketing the first grass Texans of the season. A well known firm, which came here as a "branch" of the St. Louis house, sold last week, every day but one, more cattle than the total receipts at St. Louis. For the week the "branch" sold more cattle than the total arrivals of cattle at St. Louis. In this case of the tail wagging the dog? As usual at this time of the year the horse market is generally quiet and there are rather more sellers than buyers. In the fall of the year a great many people sell their horses rather than take care of them during the winter. This throws a good many drivers and saddlers good and bad upon the fall market. While Chicago has nearly 25 miles of cable railways there are always large numbers of street car horses being thrown out of the service. Many of these are bought by peddlers about town, and not a few of the mares go to the country as breeders.

ST. LOUIS MARKET LETTER. Fluctuations—Actual Sales of Steers, Horses and Hogs.

EAST ST. LOUIS, ILLINOIS, Nov. 10, 1885. Regular Correspondence Texas Live Stock Journal. In the fore part of the week there was a slight improvement in prices on all grades, but this did not last, and by Friday most of the advances on range cattle were lost. Total offerings were comparatively light, and the bulk consisted of Indian and range cattle. Good native steers were scarce and wanted and the few droves offered each day sold promptly at stiffer figures. They are still stiff at the present writing. This is not the case with Texas cattle. Yesterday and to-day the run was large, Watts, Holmes & Co. of Estacado plains, and the St. Louis Cattle company sending in larger train loads of common to medium grass Texas. Sales were made at an average of \$2 00 per 100 lbs. To-day the market was slow on Texas steers and prices weaker. Good native steers were scarce and wanted.

Here are a few representative sales: 66 Texas cows... 702 \$1 10; 14 " bulls... 132 1 82; 49 Indian steers... 820 2 95; 44 Texas cows... 869 2 50; 123 " " 739 3 30; 21 " " 800 2 95; 240 half-bred... 800 2 95; 45 Texas steers... 1041 4 75; 85 " " 812 2 40; 47 " " 873 3 45; 24 " " 1012 3 20; 71 " " 892 2 50; 167 " " 765 2 05; 148 " " 790 2 75. The Texas horse market is very slow after much urging and prices range from \$20 00 to \$40 00 per head. The season is over but they still keep on coming in. Native hogs are active and the large supply found prompt disposal at steady figures, the range being from \$3 00 to \$3 65 per head for common to prime. Corned Texas hogs will bring this range easily.

RATTLE. W. H. Leonard, the Missouri cattle breeder, who has entered into a partnership with John Brookman, gives the following facts from his experience in crossing Polled-Angus and Gallo-way cattle on other breeds. In crossing with the Herefords the result is a white-faced muley, and it makes no difference whether a Hereford or a Gallo-way bull is used, the result is the same. Mr. Leonard finds that the polled cattle have the hardest work getting rid of the horns when crossed with thoroughbred Shorthorns, but even then the result is not doubtful. In one herd of 250 calves there was not a horn on a single calf, and on one calf there was not a deep black color. In another herd, numbering 137 head, all were black and without horns. Mr. Leonard thinks the best plan in breeding is to use thoroughbred bulls on the grades that you get from the first cross, and in that way an animal is secured that has nearly all the points of the pure stock.—[New Mexico Stock Grower.

A CALIFORNIA OUTFIT.

A Fine Stock Ranch in Tulare County. Pacific Rural Press. Editor Press:—We recently had the pleasure of driving over the lands of Henry C. Moore, one of the foremost live-stock ranchers of Tulare county.

The dwelling house, orchard, barns, etc., are about one-fourth of a mile from the gate. Here we have an unpretentious yet substantial farm house, arrangements for convenience and comfort, with an abundant supply of good cold water and surrounded by handsome shade trees and orchard grounds.

The Valley of the Kaweah. Several miles in width, the river, on leaving its mountain canyon, having divided into a number of streams, each of which is known by a distinct name.

Extending from the bank, in width from 100 to 200 yards, including both sides, is the lower valley, which overflows during the heavy rainy season.

On low, moist grounds, just above the line of overflow, the finest potatoes are cultivated. From 12 acres this season 240 bushels were dug.

GRASSES AND FORAGE PLANTS. This is pre-eminently a grass growing region. On this farm 60 acres are in alfalfa, from which at least four crops are annually cut for hay, affording about six tons per acre per season.

We would here remark that we have great confidence in Mr. Moore's experience and discernment, and believe his reason for much of the prejudice existing against Johnson grass is entirely to highest credit; but as a precautionary suggestion we would say that we have heard many expressions of dissatisfaction on account of experiments with this grass, one im-

portant feature being that when once set in a field it is almost impossible, if desired, to get rid of it. This grass is not a true evergreen, as it dies down in winter.

Red top and timothy mixed on some of his lower grounds are very fine, growing and remaining green the year round. Several acres are in Australian rye grass, which flourishes in moist ground but don't withstand the long drought of this country on higher ground without irrigation.

THE STOCK. About 500 head of hogs of Berkshire and Poland-China varieties are kept. The Berkshire is now being bred with a little Essex mixed. Last winter 240 fat hogs were sold, which, fattened on corn, averaged 240 pounds each.

In his herd Mr. M. has about 200 head of finely graded cattle, from one-half to seven-eighths Shorthorn stock of various ages, but principally young. He has a few thoroughbreds which are considered among the finest Shorthorns in the state. Of these we will mention by name as follows: Cow, Miss Leslie 4th, deep red; calved September 10, 1877; weighed nearly 1700 pounds at three years old.
