Uniform System of Working the Range.

By John N. Simpson, President Texas Live Stock Association. The subject allotted me is like a short horse, "soon curried." This hall is full of men, being members of range associations, became so from the knowledge of the necessity for uniformity in the management of range stocks. I can outline no better system than we have, nor do I believe there is much greater degree of perfection to be attained than we now have.

The cattle interests of the continent are closely interested and its resources should be handled to the best possible advantage. From Durango south there are but few cattle ranges, except on the lower or hot lands on which there are a considerable number of cattle raised to full size, but they do not pasture well there and are taken to the interior or farming districts to be fattened on the surplus grass on the farms, grain being too expensive for beef fattening, the cattle are put on the local markets of the country in very poor condition. A few cattle are exported from the coast lands to the Cuban and other islands and supply rangelands on the Spanish Main. Mutton is used extensively in the cities of Southern Mexico, which is supplied principally from the central part of the Republic. A few sheep are raised in Northern Mexico, and a few imported from New Mexico into Southern Texas.
